

St. Mary's Visitor Restrictions

Updated July 10, 2020

All visitors are subject to screening.

Visitors who do not pass screening assessment will NOT be allowed to enter St. Mary's Health System at any location. All visitors must:

1. Perform hand hygiene prior to entering and upon leaving the patient's room/care area
2. Wear a mask at all times while in the facility
3. Remain with the patient they are visiting/accompanying

Emergency Department and Diagnostics Areas:

One person may accompany the patient for ED/Provider visit, procedural exam, or test.

Physician Practices:

- **Women's Health Associates:** One spouse or support person may accompany patient.
- **Oncology & Infusion Therapy:** One person may accompany the patient.
- **CCS Pediatrics:** Two parent/guardians may accompany the minor patient.
- **Extraordinary circumstances:** One person, if their presence is necessary to assist with mobility or for communication with the care team.

Outpatient Surgery and Procedural Areas:

One person is permitted to accompany the patient into Day Surgery until patient is taken for procedure. Visitor will be asked to wait outside the building and will be contacted when they can return to patient.

Hospital Inpatient Areas:

- **Pediatrics:** Two parent/guardians at a time for hospitalized pediatric patients.
- **FBU – Labor & Delivery:** One partner/support person allowed in labor/delivery for duration of mother's stay.
- **Critical Care:** One visitor, if ICU patient is stable. Visitation to be managed by the care team.
- **End of Life:** Two visitors maximum at any time; visitation to be managed by the care team.

Patient Discharges:

Patients will be brought to an appropriate entrance for pick up.

All visits are subject to the approval of, and will be managed by, the care team.
